Good Health Pass - Taskforce and New Members

- › Announcement - Good Health Pass/Trust over IP/ID2020 press release
 - › To be posted to LF media wire (following approval of \$1k fee)
- › Good Health Pass Taskforce - successful/well-attended kick off (Feb 23)
- › Taskforce will sponsor the work of a Good Health Pass “Drafting Group”
 - › Aim - publish Trust Framework by May 30 ... with bulk of work to be completed Mar 15 - Apr 15
- › Good Health Pass contributors who participate in the Trust Framework “Drafting Group” will be asked to join Trust over IP.

Revised Project Charter

- › Trust over IP is not required to adopt new Project Charter
 - › Main benefits - simple way to “join” WGs, reduced administration for WG charters, new Code of Conduct
 - › Other changes - Chairperson model, “Associate” to “General” membership
- › Trust over IP maintains full ability to define membership fee structure, approvals process for deliverables and IP/licensing terms
- › Questions discussed with Linux Foundation - Feb 4

RESOLVED: that the revised (JDF 5.0) Project Charter is hereby approved for adoption.

Letter of Agreement - ToIP & Sovrin

- › Ongoing confusion in the market - i.e Trust over IP is “*just the new Sovrin?*”
 - › Lack of clarity leads to messaging that must be corrected - i.e. that Trust over IP and Sovrin compete or covers the same conceptual ground
- › No mechanism in place for collaboration and sharing information
- › Proposed “Letter of Agreement” - mutual recognition and non-binding framework for a liaison relationship
 - › Reviewed by JDF for comment - agree with form and approach
 - › Supported by Sovrin - aim to present to Board of Trustees for approval.

RESOLVED: that the ToIP/Sovrin Letter of Agreement is hereby approved for adoption.

Collaboration with Kantara

- › Jim St Clair - Steering member (Lumedic) - has raised the possibility of establishing an agreement with Kantara
- › Aim of the agreement would be to leverage Kantara's conformity assessment and certification capabilities
 - › Trust over IP specifications run through Kantara's assessment, approval and Trust Mark system
- › Question: does the Committee want to explore this approach further by drafting an agreement on these parameters?

Update - Communications, Revenue, Membership

- › Communications - continues to be very active
 - › Good Health Pass, Infographic (Mar 15), logo usage direction from LF, upcoming podcast (SSI Orbit) and video (Financially Speaking) interviews
- › Revenue - after Special Topic call (Feb 24), seeking info from LF and JDF
 - › Steering (up to \$50k), Contributor (up to \$5k)
 - › Most JDF projects have 0.25 Program Manager - only ToIP has full-time PM
 - › Further discussion on fees, certification, sponsorship required
- › Membership - renewals for most (17 of 23) paid members - May 2021
 - › Renewal to Dec '21 then shifting to calendar-based fiscal year
