Steering Committee Elections (1 of 3)

- Voting Members of the SC are normally elected for 3yr term, with $\frac{1}{3}$ of the SC voting members up for election each year.
- Terms for initial SC Members as stated in the ToIP Foundation Governance Policies:
First five >100 and first three <100 Steering Members: 3 year term
Second five >100 and second three <100 Steering Members: 2 year term
Final five >100 and Final 4 <100 Steering Members: 1 year term
- >100 Steering Members: No companies are up for reelection until next year

- › The full GHP Interoperability Blueprint v0.2.0 was completed last Friday
 - › 180 pages
 - › Includes a 33 page glossary with over 200 terms
 - › 9 categories of recommendations

- › Industry consultations are underway all this week
 - › IATA
 - › Hospital & Travel Industry Workgroup
 - › World Travel & Tourism Council
