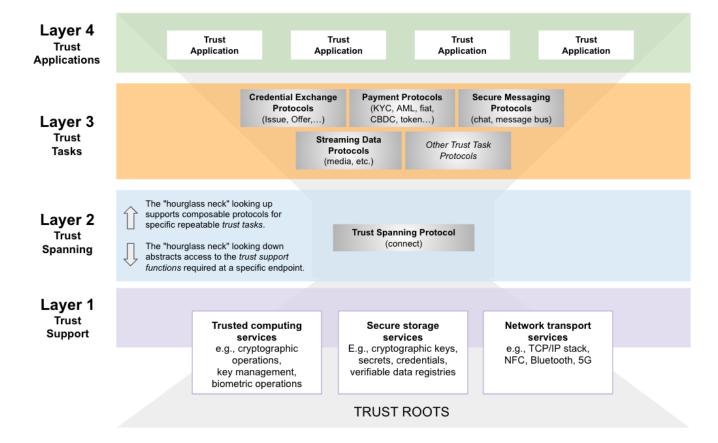

action item (above), Drummond posted a proposed solution. Meeting: e reviewed the main points of the issue #31 thread in a good half-hour discussion. were was general agreement with the main points in the thread — that Layer 2s and 3 are clearly a protocol stack, but yer 1 is more challenging because it is not a protocol, rather a set of interfaces to the trust support functions needed to proport Layer 2. enjing pointed out that this diagram is "overloaded" since it is not an overall architectural diagram, rather it only shows the otocol stack within a single Endpoint System. ere was consensus that a diagram appearing this early in the document could be simpler and lighter, and that a more mprehensive "full stack" diagram could be included at the end of the document.
